



Passed out.

North leads the 7 of clubs, not because North wants a ruff. When you have long trumps on defense, you typically don't want to ruff but to run declarer out of trumps so declarer loses control of the hand.

Hand 1: 9

North (Robot): ♠AJ5, ♥KJ1075, ♦Q85, ♣6

West (Robot): ♠K643, ♥A6432, ♦KJ, ♣9

East (Robot): ♠107, ♥Q9, ♦6432, ♣K1043

South (texashen): ♠Q982, ♥8, ♦A1097, ♣A82

Lead: ♣7

Trumps: ♣5, ♣J, ♣Q

Score: 1♥x West, 1-0

I win the Q of clubs and return my 8 of hearts as I don't want declarer ruffing spades on the board.

East (Robot): ♠107, ♥Q, ♦6432, ♣K1043




Trumps: ♥4, ♥9, ♥8

Score: 1♥x West, 2-0


Partner plays the 5 of hearts removing dummy's last trump.




Then 7 of spades to the King and Ace.




Jack of hearts to the Ace.




Club to the King and ace.
